

REGULAR SESSION, COMMON COUNCIL, January 9, 2023

Be it Remembered that the Common Council of the City of Plymouth, Indiana, met in regular session on January 9, 2023. The meeting was held in the Council Chambers, on the second floor of the City Building, 124 N. Michigan St., Plymouth, Indiana and was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Senter led the Pledge of Allegiance and Councilman Ecker offered prayer.

Mayor Senter presided for Council Members Greg Compton, Duane Culp, Don Ecker Jr, Jeff Houin, Robert Listenberger, Randy Longanecker and Shiloh Carothers Milner. City Attorney Surrisi and Clerk-Treasurer Gorski were present. The public was able to see and hear the meeting through Microsoft Teams.

Council Members Culp and Compton moved and seconded to approve the minutes of the regular session of the Common Council on December 27, 2022 as presented. The motion carried.

Council Members Ecker and Compton moved and seconded to set the 2023 meeting dates for the 2nd and 4th Mondays of the month with the exception of moving the December 25th meeting to the following Wednesday on December 27, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers. The motion carried.

Surrisi states that for Stellar Communities they just started the process to initiate the grant closeout for the Rees Theatre projects and the grant administrator, Shannon McLoed, will be doing that work and there will be a final meeting with the OCRA folks to close that out in the coming month or so. He states that they are wrapping up River Park Square Phase Two and continuing the engineering for Greenways Trail Phase Three.


Kevin Berger explains that for his project that the fifth building is being framed currently and the first is being drywalled. He states that they are looking at occupancy sometime around the first of May.
