I have looked into the request to place a crosswalk across William Street in order for pedestrians to cross the street midblock. Per the Federal Highway Administrations Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devises (MUTCD) "Crosswalk lines should not be used indiscriminately" and an engineering study should be done before placing a crosswalk that is located away from an approach controlled by a stop or yield sign. For further information I have included section 3B-18 of the MUTCD. See 3B-18 paragraph 09 for more information outlining the engineering study considerations for midblock crosswalks. If an engineering study warrants the proposed midblock crossing, then the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessibility will need to be addressed. Modifications may need to be made to both public and private property in order to meet ADA requirements.
