- 1. Surveyor quote for replat work \$7,620.00, we did supply a lot of info from Woolpert. Surveyor is very busy, expecting 60 days to complete.
- 2. To expedite construction Building Commissioner agreed to issue Building Permit to Aeromotive with understanding replat is being done. Aeromotive waiting for State Building Approval & Drainage plan.
- 3. Alpha Flight will be leasing B hangar once Aeromotive is out. We are arranging a sublease to Michiana Aircraft Service for a short period (approximately 1 year). While they investigate building their own large facility.
- 4. If Aeromotive is able to get moved quick we will schedule the last of the Corporate Apron concrete work for 1st thing early spring.
- 5. New light controls for CTAF change done.
- 6. Our plow truck that has been on loan from the Street Department has finally rusted out to the point it needs replaced. We have Clerk/Treasures blessing to ask City Council to appropriate funds from our Cumulative Capitol fund to purchase a Ford F-450 (which we confirmed would work for the job by borrowing one from Street Department). Will be spending approximately \$55,000 total with a 10' plow and a dump bed. Have quotes from outfitter recommended by Street department for plow and bed. Truck is \$37,004.00
- 7. New (2011 Crown Victory) courtesy car acquired from Police Department, traded off '99 Taurus which need more repairs than value of car. Now have twin Crown Vic's (Pilots favorite), numbered 1 & 2 so Pilots know which one they have the keys for. Total cost with trade \$1800 approximate.
- 8. High School Program: we were hoping for 30 students, we already have 25+ just from Plymouth!
- 9. Great meeting with Ivy Tech. Working out details for High School program to get College credits. Also very likely that we will have a College level program within 2 years...We are going to need more room, Classrooms and Hangars.
- 10. Alpha Flight is getting a good response for the CMA Summer Camp, expecting a record summer in fuel sales.
- 11. I passed FOI- FAA Fundamentals of Instructing test and am planning to take FAA Instrument and Instrument Instructor written test around May 1st.
- 12. Monthly Sales: Dec= \$7,365.89, Jan=\$4,393.37, Feb=\$4,110.92
- 13. February #4 signed Guest Register, #4 signed out car, #31 fuel purchases
