## PLYMOUTH PLAN COMMISSION JANUARY 5, 2021

The Plymouth Plan Commission met in regular session in the Council Chambers of the City Building, 124 North Michigan Street, Plymouth, Indiana on January 5, 2021 at 7:00 p.m.

<u>PC 2020-12</u>: Donald and Mary Lou Fritz, 13291 5D Rd, Plymouth, IN 46563: A three (3) lot Minor Subdivision on parcels 50-42-17-000-103.000-009 and 50-42-20-000-008.000-009, located at 13291 5D Rd, Plymouth, IN 46563, zoned R-1, Rural Residential District, 316 Gilmore St., Plymouth, IN.

Plan Consultant Booker reviewed the Findings of Fact. At the previous Technical Review Committee meeting there were no questions or comments on the case. Booker stated that the land is in a flood plain and does include some emergent wetland areas.

Brother of the Applicant, Bryan Stutler, was present to answer questions regarding the case. Stutler stated that this replat of the land is so that when his father passes away that the land could be split between 3 brothers. On the emergent wetlands he believed that this was the area that Bob Deon came out and started to try to dig a pond on land that was not his.

Eads asked if there were any houses on the South Side of 5D. Booker explained that there were not any other than what is pictured on the plat.

Stutler stated that the piece of land has been owned since 1969 and it has not flooded. Booker stated that in order to get out of the flood plain an engineering study would need to be done on the land.

Commissioners Webster and Eads moved and seconded to open the public hearing. The motion carried. There were no comments from the public. Commissioners Webster and Eads moved and seconded to close the public hearing. The motion carried.

Walters stated that since it was not up to the plan commission on if someone were to build on the property, he would see no reason to not pass the case.

Commissioners Walters and Eads moved and seconded to approve PC 2020-12 as presented. The motion passed by roll call vote.

Webster asked Stan Klotz if he knew anything about the container issue. Klotz stated that they are not changing it right now, but instead will be dealing with it on a case-by-case basis. This case will be dropped for a while unless a complaint is made on the container.

Feece mentioned that the couple that wanted to have goats on their property had moved out and someone else has moved in. Booker mentioned that another case may be going in front of the BZA for a cow. This property is adjacent to the Centennial Crossings Project.

There being no other business Commissioners Webster and Walters moved and seconded to adjourn the meeting. The proton carried and the meeting adjourned at 7:35. p.m.
