

REGULAR SESSION, BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY, February 14, 2022

The Board of Public Works and Safety of Plymouth, Indiana, met in Regular Session at 6:00 p.m. on February 14, 2022. The meeting was held in the Council Chambers, on the second floor of the City Building, 124 N. Michigan St., Plymouth, Indiana.

Mayor Senter called the meeting to order. Senter presided for Board Members Shiloh Milner, Bill Walters, Duane Culp, and Jeff Houin who were physically present. City Attorney Surtisi and Clerk-Treasurer Gorski were also present. The public was able to see and hear the meeting through Microsoft Teams.

Board Members Houin and Walters moved and seconded to approve the minutes of both the Regular Session & Joint Executive Session meeting of January 24, 2022. The motion carried.

City Attorney Surtisi started off the meeting by opening the bids for 2 ¾ ton pick-up trucks. The bids were listed as follows.

Police Chief Bacon would like to extend an offer of employment for a Police Officer position to Joshua Fose.

Board Members Houin and Walters moved and seconded to approve the request. The motion carried.
